Allen Caskie is Chief Counsel for Federal Relations at the American Council of Life Insurers. At the ACLI, Mr. Caskie is the lead lobbyist on the project for creating an optional federal charter for life insurers as well as for privacy issues and terrorism insurance legislation. In 2000, Mr. Caskie took a leave of absence from the ACLI to serve as Executive Director of the Financial Services Coordinating Council, an alliance composed of the principal trade associations for the banking, insurance and securities industries. Prior to that, Mr. Caskie focused primarily on financial modernization issues, having spent the last few years as the chief legislative negotiator and lobbyist for the ACLI during congressional consideration of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act and its predecessor bills. He has also serves as the ACLI antitrust counsel.

Prior to joining the ACLI in 1977, Mr. Caskie was a trial attorney with the Federal Trade Commission, concentrating on consumer protection issues, and served on the personal staffs of Senators John Sparkman, and Lister Hill, and on the professional staff of the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations under Senator John McClellan. Mr. Caskie received a BS in Commerce from Washington & Lee University 1969 and a JD from Emory University Law School in 1972.
