## Actuaries to Issue Statement on Social Security

**What:** The **American Academy of Actuaries** will issue a policy statement on Social Security during a news briefing at the National Press Club. The statement will provide an actuarial perspective on the program and advocate a course of action to return Social Security to long-term financial soundness.
