Corey N. Berger, F.S.A., M.A.A.A., is a Senior Consultant with Reden & Anders, Ltd. (R&A), and has been providing actuarial consulting services in the area of managed health care since 1994. His clients have included HMOs, physician groups, provider sponsored health care organizations, employers, other consulting organizations, and the Society of Actuaries. He has worked extensively in the areas of managed health care pricing, capitation development, product development, contracting, reserve development, and pharmacy pricing.

Over the last several years, Corey has worked with providers to assist them in evaluating and managing the risk associated with providing healthcare. Specific tasks have been the development of allocations between providers of global capitation payments, review of experience data to assist in both updating the prices for current products and developing prices for new products, and estimating unpaid claim liabilities in order to assist in financial projections. Most recently, he has worked extensively in analyzing hospital and physician contracts and evaluating prescription drug benefit designs including proposals for a Medicare prescription drug benefit.

Corey is a Fellow of the Society of Actuaries, and a Member of the American Academy of Actuaries. He graduated from Washington University in St. Louis with a degree in Mathematics and Economics. Prior to joining R&A, Corey was a consultant in the Health Industry Consulting Practice of Towers Perrin in Atlanta.
