- Develop webinars and briefings for internal as well as external audiences on relevant Academy health policy work.

Responsibilities include providing staff support (e.g., drafting meeting minutes, maintaining records, developing agendas, tracking projects, and coordinating members' efforts) and monitoring relevant legislation and regulation of importance to Academy members and the actuarial profession.

Knowledge/experience in health policy relevant to U.S. insurance/regulatory issues desired.
