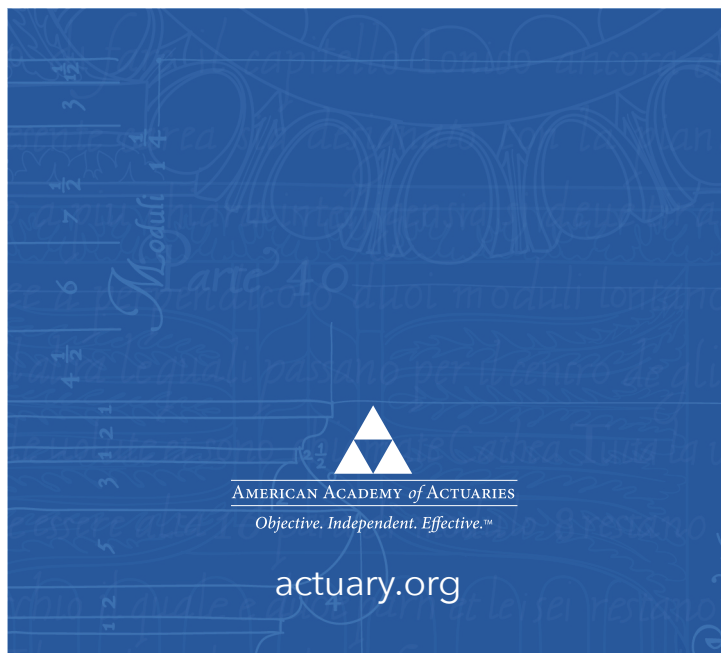


PROFESSIONALISM RESOURCES

Professionalism is at the core of the Academy's mission. The Academy developed and maintains the building blocks of professionalism for the U.S. actuarial profession, which provides tools and resources to achieve and maintain a high level of professionalism and assist the profession in maintaining a strong self-regulation system, including:

- The Code of Professional Conduct
- U.S. Qualification Standards and Attestation Form
- Actuarial standards of practice (through the Actuarial Standards Board)
- Counseling and discipline (through the Actuarial Board for Counseling and Discipline)
- [Professionalism resources](#) (e.g., webinars, discussion papers, Applicability Guidelines for ASOPs, speakers bureau, presidential papers, and monthly Professionalism Counts articles)

The Academy also has a podcast, "Actuary Voices," which shares conversations with our members on why and how they chose actuarial careers.
