The American Academy of Actuaries<sup>1</sup> Life Illustrations Work Group has reviewed the Meeting Summary Report of the Nov. 20, 2015, Life Insurance and Annuities (A) Committee meeting and understands that a new working group has been formed to explore the disclosures required in Model #580 and #582. In our review of these models and the summary report, it appears that review of the Buyer's Guide was omitted from the scope of the charge. We believe this omission was unintentional and suggest that the charge be expanded to include review of the Buyer's Guide, because an exploration would not be complete without the review of all applicable disclosures.
